Join NIH in Celebrating Earth Day!

Earth Day was first celebrated on April 22, 1970 throughout the United States as a way to increase environmental awareness. Millions of individuals participated in the first Earth Day, which was so successful that it contributed to the formation of the United States Environmental Protection Agency in July of that same year! Now, 48 years later, over 1 billion people participate in Earth Day events in192 countries. To promote environmental stewardship, NIH hosts annual Earth Day activities at many of its locations. Activities are held in conjunction with Take Your Child to Work Day to help educate future generations about the importance of the environment. Earth Day activities feature interactive exhibits to teach children (and their parents)! Some of these Earth Day 2018 activities also share the central theme of "End Plastic Pollution."

Rocky Mountain Labs (RML) – The RML campus in Montana is hosting its third annual Earth Day Poster contest. The theme of this year's contest is: End Plastic Pollution. Submissions are due to Kristine Schmitt by April 19, 2018. Posters will be displayed and winners will be announced at the RML Take Your Child to Work Day on April 26, 2018.
