Bethesda campus activities (collections are from November 13-16 during business hours):

- Electronics recycling (Both personal and non-accountable government property), at drop-off locations in the lobbies of these buildings: 1, 10 (South Lobby), 13, 31A, 35, 38A, 40, 45, 50.
- Plastic film/bag recycling, located in Building 10 at the B2 loading dock and at the Supply Store.
 - Acceptable: grocery, zip-lock bags, shrink wraps, clear plastic pillows (deflated), bubble wrap and case wrap for bottled beverages;
 - Unacceptable: green/biodegradable air pillows, chips/candy/cookie wrappers or bags and rigid (hard) plastic film, such as bottles, tapes, packing peanuts, paper and paper towels.
- Biodegradable utensils collection in special containers located in NIH cafeterias next to the recycling and trash bins.
- Cafeteria recycling information tables on Thursday, November 15 from 11am to 1pm in these buildings: 10 (B1 & 2nd floor), 31, 45, 35, and 38.

Research Triangle Park campus activities:

- The NIEHS is promoting its new Environmental Management Systems (EMS) Awareness Training, which increases employee awareness of workplace environmental impacts. This is an ongoing promotion that will continue throughout November.
- Collections for various items for recycling or reuse, such as gently used winter coats, eyeglasses, cell phones, and pet supplies on November 15.
